Head of DCB Christmas Intro

As 2018 draws to a close I would like to take the opportunity to thank all of the wonderful volunteers involved in the development of cricket in Derbyshire.

2018 has been a successful year for the DCB and a year in which we have seen significant levels of investment in facilities in Derbyshire. We have worked hard with clubs to secure over

£400,000 worth of investment ranging from new patios & seating through to building development.

We provided support and guidance to 57 clubs to deliver All Stars Cricket which saw a 58% increase from 2017. Over 1500 5-8 year olds took part in the programme during the summer with over 350 girls.

We were blessed with fantastic weather throughout the summer which no doubt contributed to a 7% increase in the number of junior games played. Over 1200 fixtures were played during the summer. This was also the case in open age cricket with more games being played than in the previous three years.

There are still challenges in league cricket with the number of conceded games increasing by 4% on 2017. There are many contributing factors, however this is something we need to support clubs to address in 2019.

All of the DCB team have worked incredibly hard through the year to support the network of cricket in Derbyshire. We are an evolving team and I am sure as we move into 2019 with our new structure you will feel a greater presence and level of support.

I am excited to see what 2019 will bring and I am confident that it will be another successful year for Cricket in Derbyshire.

DCB Structure



DCB has restructured its team with the aim of providing an improved level of support to clubs and other partners. Three Club & Community Officer roles have been created with each one responsible for the relationship and development of an allocated number of clubs in the county. Additionally they will hold strategic county responsibility in other important areas, the following is a condensed version of the responsibilities they hold.

James Colton covers clubs in the High Peak, Chesterfield, North East Derbyshire and parts of the Derbyshire Dales. James is also the lead on Chance to Shine, DCB Holiday Programme, Schools & Education (including school competitions).

Tom Coxhead looks after clubs in Bolsover, Amber Valley and parts of the Derbyshire Dales. He also leads on All Stars, Club Competitions, Cricket World Cup and Junior Leagues.

The newest member of the team is Charlie Storr who predominantly supports clubs in Derby City, Erewash and South Derbyshire. Charlie is also the lead officer for Women & Girls, Disability and Inclusion & Diversity.

In addition each will have an involvement in supporting the Clubmark process in their respective areas. Clubs also have the opportunity to schedule in a 1 to 1 meeting with their club and community officer, we hope that clubs will take up this offer. Your officer will be in touch in the New Year to book in meetings.





Club Cricket



NatWest CricketForce (NWCF) is a nationwide initiative aimed at cricket clubs. The programme is designed to bring clubs and local communities closer together and ensure grounds and facilities are ready for the new season. In 2019 NWCF weekend will take place from 5th to 7th April with a focus on projects to digitize cricket clubs or improve catering provision: from improving your club's internet connection or introducing faster payment systems , to creating areas for people to socialize and watch cricket on a big screen or outside over a BBQ. You could even install a new kitchen!

Over the years Derbyshire clubs have supported the event in large numbers and club development manager Mick Glenn is hoping they will do so again. Glenn is keen to encourage clubs to take part commenting "2019 is set to be a huge summer of cricket and NatWest CricketForce can play a key role in helping clubs maximize opportunities. We

would like clubs to partake in projects which are going to attract more people to the cricket club and ones which will create a social and welcoming environment for families".

Due to the <u>Cricket World Cup Clubs Programme</u> opening last month registrations to take part in <u>NWCF 2019</u> will open in January. We will advise clubs when registration is open.

<u>Clubmark Support</u> – DCB will be running two ECB Clubmark Workshops for all clubs due for re-accreditation and any clubs that are working towards gaining ECB Clubmark accreditation in 2019.

We are running these workshops with the aim of providing clubs with a better understanding of the process, the workshops are as follows:










Funding Opportunities



Cricket World Cup Fund – the fund aims to support cricket clubs engaged in the Cricket World Cup Club Programme who want to enhance their facilities by improving digital capacity or catering provision. See https://clubs.cricketworldcup.com/ for full details on how to apply for a fixed grant of £1000.

Derbyshire County Council Action Grants Scheme – is offering up to 2000 grants until May 2020 to groups who are planning projects to benefit their communities. This opportunity is available to sports clubs see https://www.derbyshire.gov.uk/community/lottery-funding/action-grants/action-grants.aspx

Capital Funding Success in 2018



Recent surveys linked to the playing of sport have highlighted the importance of high quality playing surfaces and facilities to participants. In cricket we know this is particularly important in contributing to a positive playing experience, supporting participation and player retention. Off the field facilities make a difference too, changing rooms, social areas and ancillary equipment can all have an impact to the club and community.

While historically clubs have been extremely innovative in improving what they have sometimes additional help is needed. Major projects are rarely straight forward, they can be time consuming for volunteers and

often take longer than anticipated. Planning is key to success especially where external investment is needed, often a combination of club fund-raising, grants and loans are needed to ensure projects can be completed.

Over the past 3 years DCB has played a major role in accessing capital funding support. Through working closely with clubs, ECB and other partners in excess of £450K has been secured for cricket projects in the county, a great boost to the game. The following projects have benefitted from direct funding from ECB:

Amber Valley Borough Council – Nottingham Road Sports Ground Pavilion

Clifton Cricket Club - New Pavilion

Darley Abbey Cricket Club – Non-Turf Pitch and Net Cages

Derby City Council – Non-Turf Pitches for community use

Duffield Cricket Club - New Pavilion

Elvaston Cricket Club – New Changing Rooms

Etwall Cricket Club - Purchase of Ground

Tintwistle – Two Lane net Training Facility



A further two further projects have been put forward to ECB for ratification and are currently awaiting confirmation. In addition over twenty clubs have accessed an ECB Interest Free Loan either as match funding or additional support to get their project "over the line".

Club Development Manager Mick Glenn is keen to see more projects developed stating:

"Many club facilities do not quite meet the expectations of participants and we want to help more clubs if we possibly can". "We know that improved facilities can attract more people from the community and help create a social welcoming club, supporting the sustainability of the clubs and game"

"Over the coming months we'll be looking to find out more about potential projects for 2020 and beyond"

Schools Cricket

Chance to Shine

This year we have delivered to 7228 children in schools through the Chance to Shine programme. These children either received 6 weeks of coaching or an afternoon of activity from our coaches. We also ran 6 KS1 festivals in districts to encourage more participants in All Stars Cricket with over 1000 children taking part .

For the 2018-19 academic year all of our delivery will be aimed at KS1 students to encourage further transition to All Stars Centres. We are also running 12 festivals to ensure we increase the number of children we engage with. Over 100 teachers registered for the free teacher resources produced by Chance to Shine to upskill teachers delivery in their own lessons.

Special School Delivery

Disability cricket in Derbyshire continued to grow in 2018 with the DCB working closely with The Lord's Taverners. We expanded our programme to work with around 150 special needs children from 15 schools giving them access to a different form of physical activity. We successfully ran the joint most Table Cricket Competitions in the Country with 3 regional competitions that fed into the East Midlands Competition which was hosted at Derbyshire CCC. In

2019 we will continue to try and give more children with disabilities access to Cricket and we plan to work with 21 Schools by February 2019. We will again run 3 Competitions in early February and are hopeful of getting record attendances. We will also run some Young Leaders training for Special Schools in the New Year to assist at our Table Cricket Competitions. These

will be aimed at provided the children and young adults with not only umpiring and scoring skills but key social and communication skills.



School Competition

The 2018-19 academic year will see the rebranding of school competitions to help with the promotion of the Cricket World Cup that is happening in England during the summer. All Districts have been given a Country that they will represent at the Schools Final.







Women & Girls Cricket

2018 Recap

Recreational Women and Girls cricket continued to thrive in 2018. Derbyshire ran a comprehensive indoor offer for a variety of different age groups to maintain their interest in the game, as well as prepare them for the outdoor season. During the summer the DCB ran 8 successful Women's Softball Festivals!



The Softball Festivals attracted over 400 women and girls to the game across the county, some of whom played in 2017 but many who had their very first cricket experience and were new to the game. A huge thank you to our host clubs Elvaston, Duffield, Langley Mill, Clifton, Darley Dale, Belper Amateurs, Belper Meadows and St Anselms School, we couldn't run these festivals without you! Hopefully you will all be able to host a festival again in 2019....

What is happening in 2019?

Women and Girls recreational cricket is set to grow in a huge way in 2019. We have an extensive winter offer which will include a variety of Indoor Softball opportunities for Women, U15's and U11's. Then in the summer we aim to increase the variety of different types of softball cricket opportunities available. This will include Women's festivals and, for the first time, leagues, in addition to U9 and U11 girls softball festivals.

Women and Girls Indoor 2019

First of all, the Women's Winter World Cup, this will be a competitive indoor league at Willows Sports Centre on Sundays in January and February. This was advertised in the autumn and the 6 teams that have entered are Duffield, Belper Meadows, Belper Amateurs, South Derbyshire, Long Eaton and Ilkeston Rutland. The winner of this league will qualify for the regional finals day at Loughborough University. Good luck to all the teams!

Following the Women's Winter World Cup there will be four U15's and two U11's softball festivals which will all run on Sunday afternoons, also at Willows Sports Centre.

Women and Girls Outdoor 2019

In 2019 we will be moving away from a singular Women's Festival focus to deliver a combination of programmes which meet the needs of players new and previous. Our aim is to deliver:

Women's Softball festivals – DCB are aiming to deliver 8 festivals for 2019, these festivals will be focused on attracting new players, providing them with a fun first experience playing cricket as well as providing an attractive offer to those who can't commit to playing regular cricket.

Women's Softball leagues – DCB are aiming to run two leagues and to have at least 4 teams in each one. The format will consist of a cluster of clubs playing a number of round robin festivals against each other in a competitive manner. These leagues are aimed to meet the needs of women's teams / players who are keen to play more regular, competitive cricket.





U9 and U11 Softball festivals – These will be aimed at All Star Cricket girls and those who can't easily access club cricket. The festivals will be focused around participation and fun and are designed to be the 'next step' after All Stars. DCB aim to run four U9 festivals and two U11 festivals, with as many teams as possible at each one!

All Stars Cricket



2018 was an excellent year for All Stars Cricket with even more success stories in Derbyshire. 57 Derbyshire Centres had an amazing time running the programme which introduced 1535 children aged 5-8 to the game of Cricket. We had 15 new centres join the programme in 2018 and they all ran with good numbers. It was brilliant to see all the willing volunteers giving their time to help spread enjoyment during a lovely warm summer, Cricket would be a worse place without you!

One of the major successes from 2018 was at Youlgrave Cricket Club where 15 children from the local village took part in the programme, not bad for a rural Derby-


shire Dales Club that previously had no juniors at all! The Club hope that this can be the start of something special at one of the most picturesque grounds In the County.

At the other end of the spectrum we also had Clubs with huge numbers of participants. Coal Aston CC, Clowne

Town CC, Etwall CC, Hartshorne CC, Ilkeston Rutland CC, Mickleover CC, Melbourne CC, Spondon CC and Quarndon CC all had over 40 children take part with Duffield CC achieving the remarkable feet of 100 children for the 2nd year running!

Congratulations must also go to Ilkeston Rutland CC who were voted as our All Stars Cricket Club of the year for 2018. Well done to Charlotte and the team of volunteers for making your centre so special.

As part of the programme 400 children had the opportunity to be the Guard of Honour at Derbyshire CCC T20 games with a further 150 taking part in activities





2019 will be an incredible year with 60 centres already expressing an interest at getting involved in the programme.

We are rolling out our centre offer to Schools with more information coming in January. All Stars will be linked to the Cricket World Cup in 2019 with World Cup challenges and tickets for participants available. We will also continue to work closely with Derbyshire County Cricket Club and Loughborough Lightning to offer even more local money can't buy opportunities.

DCB Boys Player Pathway



The Summer Programme of 2018 was again action packed with a lot of games and tremendous weather throughout.

A huge thanks to all the clubs and schools who hosted our fixtures in 2018, Etwall , Shipley Hall , Morton Colliery, Ticknall , Clifton, Kilamarsh, Spondon, Charlesworth and Chisworth, Dove Holes, Buxton, Rolleston, Coal Aston, Glossop, Swarkestone, Foremarke School and Repton School.

William Hobson of the U17 Boys Squad had a fantastic season scoring 436 runs at an average of 54.50 with two hundreds.

Two players Mitchell Wagstaff and Archie Harrison played up n played up a year for the U13 Boys. All three players contributed

a year for the U15 Boys as well as Yusuf Bin Naeem played up a year for the U13 Boys. All three players contributed throughout and had great seasons.

Specialist Clinics took place for both the Boys and Girls in October, November and December for their ongoing development in the Performance Centre delivered by the DCB Pathway Coaches as well as the Derbyshire County Club Staff and Players. Dave Houghton (Head of Cricket) delivered a batting session playing against spin bowling. Steve Kirby (Bowling and Assistant Coach) delivered a bowling session for both pace and spin bowlers and Daryn Smit (County Cricket Club Wicket-Keeper) delivered a wicket-keeping session looking at posture, hands and footwork.

Honours

Anoop Chima from the U15 Boys Squad represented the Midlands at Bunbury Festival for 2018. Anoop has also progressed from the Mini-Academy to join the Academy intake for the 2018/2019 season which is a great achievement.

2019

We are currently working closely with Derbyshire County Cricket Club to create a new pathway structure which we hope to be able to publish it in early 2019. The aim is to develop an aligned, joined up pathway in Derbyshire.

We have increased the number of squads from 1 to 2 at U10 and U11 age group. This is in line with the ECB thinking which is to encourage and gain greater participation at these age groups. The DCB will have two centres at

U10's and U11's during the winter. One centre in the South at Chellaston Academy and one centre in the North at Tibshelf Community School. During the summer the squads will come together and play intra county training matches, as well as County fixtures and a Festival.

We have secured more time in the Performance Centre allowing U13-U17 Squads to access the facilities with the support from the County Club Coaching and Playing Staff throughout the winter including Dave Houghton, Steve Kirby, Mal Loye, Jonty Norris, Matt Meyer and Fran Clarkson.

DCB Women & Girls Player Pathway



Firstly a huge thanks to all the clubs who hosted our fixtures in 2018, Chester-field, Clifton, Darley Dale, Denby, Duffield, Lullington, Marehay, Morton, Rolleston, Spondon, Ticknall, Wirksworth.

The Senior Women became champions of their T20 League in 2018, this sees them returning to Division 2 for 2019. However, unfortunately in the 50 over League, despite a strong finish to the season it didn't save them from relegation to Division 3. Highlights of the season were a magnificent 108 by Bess Heath against Northamptonshire and also a fine spell of bowling by Molly Dytham against Northumberland of 4 wickets for 3 runs which also included a hat

Our U17 Girls finished 3rd in their League with the highlight of the season being a magnificent spell of bowling by Suzie Ljubojevic in a victory against Leicestershire that saw her take 5 wickets for 9 runs.

The U15 Girls finished 3rd in their League in a season that started with a fine victory against Cumbria; a game that saw two girls, Suzie Ljubojevic and Alice Harwood, score their maiden county half centuries.

A move by the ECB in 2018 saw a significant change to U13 Girls cricket, this was now Development not League Cricket and was to be played using different formats and a reduced pitch length of 19 yards. The Girls played a number of different formats and also experienced playing a game at the iconic Queens Park in Chesterfield. We had a really young U11 Development Team in 2018 who performed well, generally against older teams. The highlight of the season was the first Derbyshire Cricket Board U11 Girls Festival held at Duffield CC, an event that received great feedback from the three other counties who attended.



Honours

Three of Senior Women players, having played all the way through the Derbyshire pathway from U11, were selected for KIA Super League squads in 2018, Sarah Glenn for Loughborough Lightning, Alice Dyson for Lancashire Thunder and Bess Heath for Yorkshire Diamonds. Subsequent to this Sarah and Bess have both been selected for the England Academy Development Squad. We have two of our U17 Girls who have been selected for Regional Development Centre (RDC) squads, Imogen Cooper for Yorkshire Diamonds and Lucy Yates for Loughborough Lightning. In addition Molly Dytham and Keeley Brodrick have both been selected as reserves for the Loughborough RDC squads.

2019

Moving forward into 2019; we have again received the highest ever number of nominations for the Girls pathway with good numbers at U11 and U13. With further changes planned for the Women and Girls game it is essential that we keep involving more girls in the development squads at U11 and U13.

Everything is in place for 2019, Winter Training, Fixtures, Coaches, support from the County Club and Regional Talent Manager. All we need now is a summer as good as 2018.
